Canonisation Of Blessed Carlo Acutis. To coincide with the Jubilee of Teenagers, Pope Francis had intended to canonise Blessed Carlo at Easter 2025. However with the death of Pope Francis, things were delayed. This weekend then, Pope Leo will celebrate the canonisation along with Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati. Carlo Acutis will be the first millennial saint. In 2006, at the age of 15, he died of leukaemia. This "ordinary child", as his mother described him, discovered the hidden treasure of faith, deeply drawn as he was to the Risen Lord present in the Eucharist. His life speaks of holiness – holiness to be found in the ordinary, not the extraordinary.
